Non-fiction books are celebrated nationally throughout November. Here are some of our favourites!

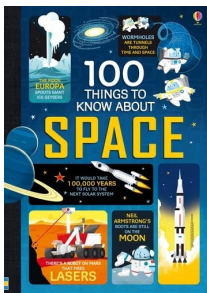


This is a wonderful book that folds out to show life beneath the ground.

It could be a super addition to your child's Christmas list and some companies offer the flexibility to spread the payment across the year too!

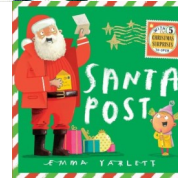
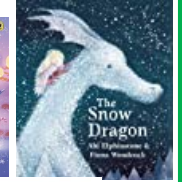

The Beast and the Bethany—Jack Meggitt- Phillips

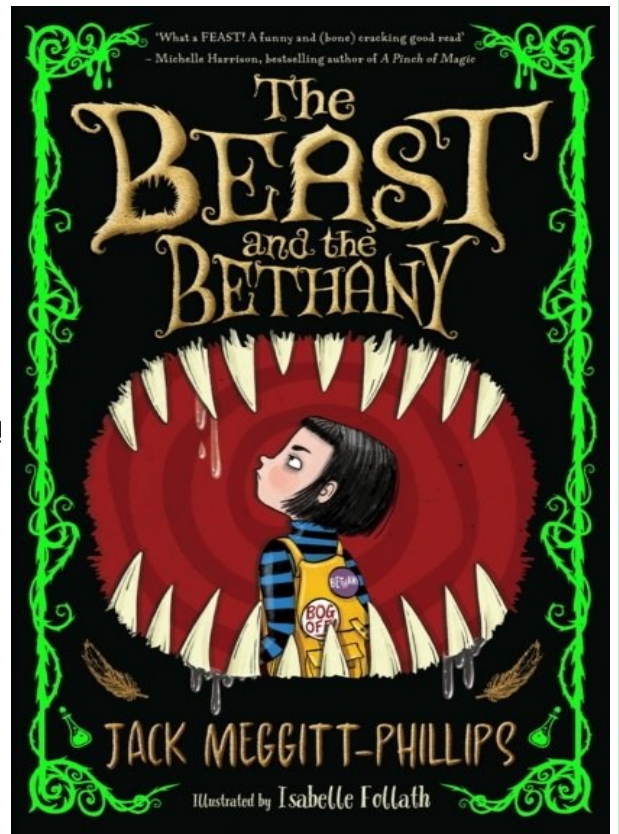
This is a superb book to read to children in Y3 or for independent readers in Year 4 and upwards.

It tells the story of Ebenezer Tweezer, a man who harbours a beast on the fourteenth floor of his huge house. To keep the beast happy, he has to feed him all manner of strange and questionable things. When the beast asks for a child, Ebenezer begins to wonder whether he has created a monster or whether there are benefits to meeting the monster's needs!

Bethany is a mean spirited orphan who is full of spite and mischief—perhaps she would be the perfect meal!?

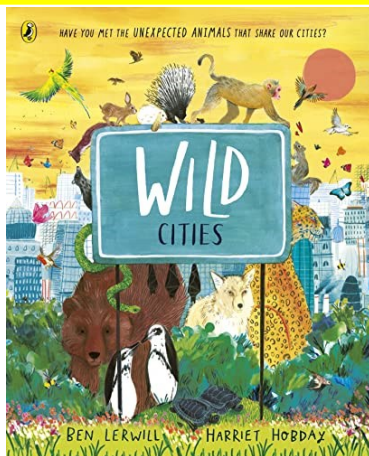
There are fabulous illustrations throughout the book and it's beautifully written. I thoroughly enjoyed it and I hope you will too!
