

Children with health needs who cannot attend school policy

Henry Chadwick Primary School.



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1. Aims

This policy aims to ensure that:

- Suitable education is arranged for pupils on roll who cannot attend school due to health needs
- Pupils, staff and parents/carers understand what the school is responsible for when this education is being provided by the local authority

2. Legislation and guidance

This policy reflects the requirements of the [Education Act 1996](#).

It is also based on guidance provided by our local authority.

This policy complies with our funding agreement and articles of association.

3. Responsibilities of the school

3.1 If the school makes the arrangements

Initially, the school will attempt to make arrangements to deliver suitable education for children with health needs who cannot attend school this may be through home tuition or attending an Alternative Provision.

The arrangements made will depend on the situation and specific health care need – this may be work sent home, children accessing learning with their peers remotely, hospital schools, other home tuition or an Alternative Provision.

The headteacher will meet with the parents to discuss the provision.

The head teacher will arrange to attend the provision / meet with the provider to check the safeguarding arrangements and the educational offer.

When the child is able to return to school, the headteacher and SENDCo (if necessary) will work with the family and alternative provision (if necessary) to plan a reintegration programme that meets the child's needs.

3.2 If the local authority makes the arrangements

If the school can't make suitable arrangements, Staffordshire Local Authority will become responsible for arranging suitable education for these pupils.

In cases where the local authority makes the arrangements, the school will:

- Work constructively with the local authority, providers, relevant agencies and parents/carers to ensure the best outcomes for the pupil
- Share information with the local authority and relevant health services as required
- Help make sure that the provision offered to the pupil is as effective as possible and that the child can be reintegrated back into school successfully

› When reintegration is anticipated, work with the local authority to:

- Plan for consistent provision during and after the period of education outside the school, allowing the pupil to access the same curriculum and materials that they would have used in school as far as possible
- Enable the pupil to stay in touch with school life (e.g. through newsletters, emails, invitations to school events or internet links to lessons from their school)
- Create individually tailored reintegration plans for each child returning to school
- Consider whether any reasonable adjustments need to be made

4. Monitoring arrangements

This policy will be reviewed annually by the headteacher. At every review, it will be approved by the full governing board.
