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In October 2010, the Equality Act introduced a Public Sector Equality Duty, which requires schools to have due regard to the need to:


- Eliminate unlawful discrimination, harassment and victimisation and other conduct prohibited by the Act;
- Advance equality of opportunity between people who share a protected characteristic and those who do not; and
- Foster good relations between people who share a protected characteristic and those who do not.

Protected Characteristics

The Equality Duty requires Henry Chadwick Primary School to consider how our activities affect the people who share these different protected characteristics and to publish information to show how we do this.

In order to meet our Equality Duty, we are required to publish Equality Information about how our policies and practices affect those with Protected Characteristics. We have considered our practices and how well we are doing and identified the following as objectives for the Trust and its schools.

- To monitor pupils' academic progress, attendance and behaviour so that appropriate interventions can be actioned to prevent under-performance by any vulnerable group.
- To monitor and analyse recruitment, promotion, assessment, pay, terms and conditions of employment, redundancy and disciplinary by protected characteristics (where data is available). We will act on any trends or patterns in the data that require action to be taken to close any gaps between those who have a protected characteristic and those who do not.

- To ensure that all students make good progress in their learning at Henry Chadwick (Ensure
 that girls make the same level of progress / achieve as well as boys)
- To ensure that our assembly programme and enrichment activities promote inclusion including all protected characteristics.
- To ensure that all enrichment activities, after school clubs and residentials are accessible to all and reasonable adjustments are made to support this.
